


Taiwan locally procured protective gowns, examination gloves, disposable caps, disposable shoe covers, medical gloves, and medical alcohol. 2. Taiwan donated one batch each of face masks, infrared thermal imaging cameras, and forehead thermometers, as well as isolation gowns, protective gowns, face shields, PCR test machines (including reagent supplies), and ventilators.


