Taiwan locally procured protective gowns, examination gloves, disposable caps, disposable shoe covers, medical gloves, and medical alcohol.<li data-bbox="901 1041 1436 1579">2. Taiwan donated one batch each of face masks, infrared thermal imaging cameras, and forehead thermometers, as well as isolation gowns, protective gowns, face shields, PCR test machines (including reagent supplies), and ventilators.<li data-bbox="901 1612 1436 2004">3. The R.O.C. (Taiwan) Embassy donated 1 million masks manufactured by the factory established by Eswatini government with Taiwan government's assistance.

The official ceremony to launch face mask factories established with the Taiwan government's assistance was held on May 21, 2021, to enhance Eswatini's capability to manufacture face masks and combat COVID-19. Taiwan also donated one batch of masks, isolation gowns, protective gowns, hat covers, shoe covers, and rapid test kits.</p>
