with governments, international organizations, and non-governmental organizations to promote a number of humanitarian aid projects assisting Syrian refugees. During the COV-ID-19 pandemic, Taiwan also provided anti-pandemic supplies to Syrian refugee camps and communities in Jordan and Turkey to help combat the disease. In 2015, Taiwan and the United States signed a memorandum of understanding establishing the Global Cooperation and Training Framework (GCTF), which provides a comprehensive platform to amplify Taiwan's strengths and help address global issues.

In addition to further strengthening relations with like-minded countries, such as the United States, Japan, and Australia, in recent years Taiwan has invited experts from the Middle East to participate in seminars on topics such as vaccine rollouts and enhancing disaster resilience capabilities, expanding cooperation and exchanges with partners from other regions.

Q: What can small sovereign nations do to maintain their independence in light of the huge changes in power in the world?

A: As smaller nations face an everchanging global landscape, they must be wise if they hope to succeed. Only then can they safeguard their national sovereignty and dignity. Being wise calls for bolstering national strengths and developing economic advantages. It also requires proactively embracing the international community, extensively cultivating friendships, and forging robust and pragmatic partnerships with like-minded nations. This can help smaller countries remain resilient in a dynamic world and obtain the greatest benefit.

Although Taiwan is a small country in terms of land area, it stands out as a beacon of democracy in Asia, known for its inclusive and diverse culture. Taiwan ranks among the top 25 global trading partners and has the fifthlargest foreign exchange reserves in the world. It boasts an advanced high-tech industry, particularly with regard to semiconductor foundries. accounting for up to 65 percent of global output. Moreover, Taiwan occupies a strategic position in the Western Pacific first island chain and stands on the front lines, defending the global democratic community against authoritarian China. Taiwan plays a critical role in safeguarding the peace and stability of the Indo-

Pacific region. Although China has never ceased its attempts to diminish Taiwan's international presence, Taiwan has still managed to actively participate in the international community and make a number of concrete contributions. We are pleased that the world recognizes Taiwan's significance and the threats it faces from China. Recent international events, including QUAD, the G7 Summit, and the EU-US Summit, have attached great importance to peace and stability across the Taiwan Strait. This is a true testament to the international support Taiwan has received. Taiwan will continue to advance steadfast diplomacy in the spirit of mutual assistance for mutual benefit and seek to enhance bilateral relations with Kuwait and other Middle Eastern nations. We hope that countries worldwide will better understand the challenges facing Taiwan and the extent of its international contributions and therefore extend even greater support to Taiwan.

Q: What role does diplomacy play in ensuring the continued sovereignty of Taiwan? How does that inform the Ministry's bilateral relations?

A: Given the threats and challenges from China, international support is of paramount importance for Taiwan to safeguard its sovereignty, rights, and interests. Diplomacy naturally plays a pivotal role in this regard. Taiwan proactively promotes steadfast diplomacy, embraces the international community, and consolidates relations with diplomatic allies. It also deepens substantive relations and expands cooperation in various domains with friendly, like-minded nations. For example, last December, Taiwan signed an agreement on double taxation avoidance and the prevention of tax evasion with Saudi Arabia, as well as a memorandum of understanding with Turkey on cooperation relating to small and medium-

sized enterprises.

As a force for good in the world, Taiwan makes concrete contributions to the global community through its soft power and warm power. Q: What role does public diplomacy play in building stronger relations with key countries?

A: Public diplomacy differs from traditional diplomatic strategies in that it entails the use of information sharing, national branding, cultural exchanges, and other avenues to create, enhance, and promote a favorable national image, which cultivates positive perceptions of the country among all sectors. This also bolsters identification with and support for Taiwan and helps create a more friendly international environment.

China creates a negative national image by employing its military and economic hard power to engage in so called "wolf warrior" aggressive threats and diplomatic intimidation, as well as utilizing its sharp power to spread disinformation, misleading the global community and disrupting the international order. In contrast, Taiwan projects a positive image to the world by upholding the core values of democracy, human rights, humanitarianism, philanthropy, multiculturalism, quality healthcare, and sustainable development.

Taiwan's private sector has abundant resources and creative capabilities. Our people are loving, compassionate, warm, and friendly, and they have endeavored to contribute to the world and many concrete results have been yielded. Taiwan has harnessed these dynamic and boundless resources in the service of public diplomacy. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) is committed to continuing to promote Taiwan's positive image and has integrated public and private resources to broaden support and forge friendships worldwide. For instance, as the COVID-19 pandemic ravaged the globe last year, Taiwan combined the strengths and resources of the government and the private sector to contribute to the international community. To date, Taiwan has donated approximately 54 million surgical masks to over 80 countries, including two million to West Asia and Africa, to which we have also donated other antipandemic supplies (such as forehead thermometers, protective gowns, and rapid test kits). More people than ever before have experienced Taiwan's warmth and have to come to recognize it as a force for good in the world.

In addition to its efforts in traditional areas of national branding, MOFA and its overseas missions have also enhanced Taiwan's positive image through Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, YouTube, and other social media platforms. Fishing sector in deep crisis

Shortage of fishermen

KUWAIT CITY, July 31: Head of the Kuwait Union of Fishermen Dhaher Al-Suwayyan says the fishing sector is facing an unprecedented crisis due to the shortage of fishermen as a result of the COVID-19 crisis and the closure of the country, reports Al-Qabas daily.

In a press statement, he revealed that some of the fishermen were contracted from the neighboring countries, and others have reached the age of sixty due to which their residency cannot be renewed any more.

Al-Suwayyan explained that the Kuwait fishing fleet is still in arrival of many from their countries who are awaiting their release from institutional quarantine

According to this situation, it is expected that half of the Kuwaiti fishing fleet will stop its operations unless the competent authorities take the initiative to meet the union's request to allow issuance of new work permits for the fishing sector to recruit new fishermen in order to fill this shortage and operate the rest of the fishing fleet to coincide with the beginning of the shrimp season.

This severe shortage of labor may lead to shortage of fish supplies, and will thus affect the fish markets.

Al-Suwayyan expressed his hope for the quick response of the concerned authorities and the approval of the Council of Ministers concerning the union's letter for allowing issuance of new work permits for fishermen in order to solve the crisis so that the fleet works with its full potential to provide food security of marine

He revealed that the union was surprised by some concerned parties that did not review certain decisions that are in the public interest, solve many problems, and remove the challenges.

Al-Suwayyan stressed the importance of developing the fishing sector. Regarding the fish auction and its return especially since the shrimp fishing season will start on August 1, he said, "The absence of the auction will open the door wide to a new type of black

Al-Suwayyan then asked, "Where will the fishermen go with their catches and shrimp baskets?"

He stressed the need to organize auctions in Sharq and Fahaheel markets in accordance with the precautionary measures and health controls as well as under the supervision of the concerned authorities, because the return of fish and shrimp auctions in the fish markets in Sharq and Fahaheel will restore stability to the prices and allow citizens to obtain their need for fish and shrimp in the desired quantities.

Al-Suwayyan expressed his fear that fish stalls will continue to be closed in Sharq market due to the lack of fish, adding, "Today, the number of closed stalls reached 35, which is 30 percent of the fish stalls. This is worrisome, considering that this is the first time the stalls are devoid of fish. The solution is to bring back the fish auction and allow fishing for mead fish".

He renewed the union's demand to the Ministry of Health to vaccinate the remaining fishermen, stall workers and others in preparation for the return of the fish auctions before the beginning of the shrimp fishing season.

Al-Suwayyan affirmed that 80 percent of the fishermen and workers in the stalls and brokers' offices have been vaccinated with two doses of the COVID-19 vaccine.

He expressed his hope that the crisis will end soon.

'Big difference in temp in country for 7 years'

KUWAIT CITY, July 31: The maps of the 'Urban Thermal Islands in Kuwait' project, implemented by the Science and Technology Sector at Kuwait Institute of Scientific Research (KISR), showed a big difference in the surface temperatures in the country for seven years -- from 2013 to 2020, reports Al-Qabas daily.

The maps revealed that the surface temperatures in different regions in June 2013 ranged from 30 to 43.1 degrees Celsius; but in June 2020 the temperatures ranged from 44.7 degrees Celsius to 54.4 degrees Celsius -- an increase of 11.3 degrees Celsius.

On the other hand, the surface temperatures in some areas; such as Sulaibiya farms, large national parks in the Capital, 'sabkhat areas' and artificial lakes in Khairan maintained their coolness for seven years when the Earth's temperature ranged from 30 to 35 degrees Celsius. In a recent press statement, Project Director at the institute Heba Baron disclosed that one of the main objectives of the project is to calculate the temperature variation index between the urban and agricultural areas.

Egypt envoy lauds support

'Ties with Kuwait growing in time'

KUWAIT CITY, July 31: The Egyptian Ambassador to Kuwait, HE Tareq Al-Qoni, says relations between Egypt and Kuwait are constantly developing and growing, defying the more than a year-and-a-half Covid-19 pandemic conditions, reports Al-

This came during a ceremony which was held to honor the advisor to the editor-inchief of Al-Anba newspaper, Hossam Fathi, in the presence of the deputy editor-in-chief of Al-Anba newspaper, Secretary of the Journalists Association, Adnan Al-Rashed.
