帛琉	總統雷蒙傑索 (Tommy E. Remengesau, Jr)	我們向支持帛琉發展進程的臺灣致敬,尤其刻提倡包容性精神,聯合國宣示攜手前行之目標倘遺漏臺灣 2,300 萬人,將無法實現。臺灣全民健保制度為世界典範,臺灣對帛琉之支持係實現全民健康覆蓋強而有力夥伴關係之實證。我們呼籲將臺灣納入並使其全面參與多邊決策的聯合國及世界衛生大會,以使其為實現 2030 永續發展議程作出貢獻。Palau also wishes to pay tribute to the support of Taiwan in our development journey, especially in today's spirit of inclusion. Our declaration that calls for us to move together is incomplete when Taiwan's 23 million people are left behind. Taiwan's universal health insurance program is a model for the world. Her support for Palau is an example of the power partnership in realizing universal health coverage. We call for Taiwan's full participation in multilateral decision making, here at the UN and at the World Health Assembly, where we can vouch for the contribution that she will make to realizing the 2030 Agenda.

史瓦帝尼	衛生部長 Lizzie Nkosi	雖然史國在婦女生產死亡率自 2007 年每 10 萬名婦女 589 人死亡降至 2017 年的 452 人,史國防止婦女生產死亡策略仍須精進,以使所有生產孕婦均得存活;史國 2007 年至 2017 年的新生兒死亡率則自每千名新生兒有 100 人死亡降至 53 人,未來尚須盡更多努力。我們感謝像中華民國(台灣)等夥伴對史國婦女及兒童醫療工作所予之協助,史國呼籲聯合國將台灣納入聯合國體系,我們深信他們(台灣)可為聯合國的工作及人類福祉作出巨大貢獻。 Although the Kingdom of Eswatini has seen improvement in the maternal mortality ratio from 589 deaths per 100,000 live birth in 2007 to 452 deaths per 100,000 live births in 2017, strategies for preventing maternal deaths need to be improved to ensure that no mother dies while giving life. Infant mortality ratio improved from 100 deaths per 1,000 live births in 2007 to 53 in 2017, however, more efforts need to be put in place to prevent these deaths. We are grateful to a number of partners helping and supporting us such as the Republic of China in Taiwan for their support in maternal, child health work. Eswatini continues to call upon the UN to include Taiwan in the UN system as we believe they can greatly contribute to the organization's work and human welfare.
